Tips for caregivers to help kids learn

through play!

Talk

- Talk about the tools people might use to explore caves:
 - o helmet, flashlight, gloves
- Discuss the kinds of animals that might live in a cave:
 - o bats, rodents (most bears do not hibernate in caves)
- Share how the cave and darkness make you feel.

Play Together

- Play "I Spy" to identify the different rock formations you and your child find in the cave.
- After reading the signs, use what you learned to give a guided cave tour to each other.

Explore

- Use your senses to explore the cave- describe each sensation.
- Use your cellphone flashlight to peek in dark corners!

Ideas to Learn Together Throughout the Children's Museum

- · Let your child lead the way
- Ask open-ended questions that require <u>more</u> than a "yes or no" answer
- Let your child do the work
- Encourage safe risk-taking
