through play!*

Talk

- Talk about when dinosaurs lived; what they ate; and types of dinosaurs.
- Helpful Words-
 - Paleontologist- a scientist that studies dinosaurs using fossils
 - Herbivore- eats only plants
 - Carnivore- eats only meat
 - Omnivore- eats plants and meat (like humans)

Play Together

- Practice identifying dinosaurs by using the wall graphic to match the dinosaurs to their number.
- Work together to reconstruct a dinosaur's skeleton.

Explore

- At home, test how the different shape of your teeth help you eat both meat and plants.
- Notice and describe the different physical features of the big dinosaurs in the exhibit.
- Discuss where else you have seen or might see dinosaurs or dinosaur bones.

Museum*

- Let your child lead the way
- Ask open-ended questions that require more than a "yes or no" answer
- Let your child do the work
- Encourage safe risk-taking
